## IT'S THE 'PERSON FIRST' - THEN THE DISABILITY

What is the proper way to speak to or about someone who has a disability? In speaking or writing, remember that children or adults with disabilities are like everyone else -- except they happen to have a disability. Therefore, here are a few tips for improving your language related to disabilities and handicaps.

1. Speak of the person first, then the disability.

2. Emphasize abilities, not limitations.

3. Do not label people as part of a disability group -- don't say "the disabled"; say "people with disabilities."

4. Don't give excessive praise or attention to a person with a disability; don't

patronize them.

5. Choice and independence are important. Let the person do or speak for him/herself as much as possible. If addressing an adult, say "Bill" instead of "Billy."

6. A disability is a functional limitation that interferes with a person's ability to walk, hear, talk, learn, etc. Use handicap to describe a situation or

barrier imposed by society, the environment or oneself.
